A. seventy-five percent (75%) of the defendant's disposable earnings for any pay period; or

B. an amount each week equal to forty (40) times the highest applicable minimum hourly wage rate at the place the wages were earned.

A table giving equivalent exemptions for pay periods of other than one week may be obtained from the director of the financial institutions division of the regulation and licensing department. "Disposable earnings" means that part of the defendant's wage or salary remaining after deducting the amounts that are required by law to be withheld. "Highest applicable minimum hourly wage rate" means the highest federal, state, or local minimum hourly wage rate for an eighthour day or a forty-hour week. It is immaterial whether you are exempt under federal, state, or local law from paying the highest applicable minimum hourly wage rate.

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## [YOU ARE FURTHER ORDERED, as follows:

1. If you owe the judgment debtor any money (other than wages), or become indebted to the judgment debtor before filing your answer, you must keep a sufficient amount of that money to satisfy the judgment and all costs and attorney fees due as a result of service of this writ and not pay it to the judgment debtor, unless this court enters an order releasing this writ of garnishment.
